*Syringa vulgaris* '**Krasavitsa Moskv**' (Beauty of Moscow)

- Height and width: 10-12' tall and 8' wide
- Originated by: Leonid A Kolesnikov, 1947
- Habit: Deciduous, upright
- Foliage: Green
- Flowers/Color class: D/1
- Bloom time: Midseason

Notable information: Pinkish lilac buds open to very pale lavender tint on white. Abundant panicles on a vigorous plant. It is stunning in bloom. Insignificant fall foliage.



*Syringa* '**Penda**' (Bloomerang<sup>R</sup>)

- Height and width: 4-5' tall and 4' wide
- Originated by: Tim Wood 2008
- Habit: Deciduous, upright, dwarf
- Foliage: Green
- Flowers/Color class: S/VII
- Bloom time: Late spring and re-blooms until frost

Notable information: Dark purple buds open to medium purple blooms. Deer resistant. Classic lilac fragrance.

*Syringa vulgaris* '**Charles Joly**'

- Height and width: 10-12' tall and 8-10' wide
- Cultivated by: Lemoine Nursery 1896
- Habit: Deciduous, upright
- Foliage: Green
- Flowers/Color class: D/VII
- Bloom Time: Midseason


Notable Information: One of the earlier French hybrids and the finest of the double dark reds. Has smaller thyrses of purple buds that turn to magenta and is intensely fragrant. Royal Horticultural Society Award of Merit. Insignificant fall foliage.



#### Common Purple

- Height and width: 12-15' tall and 8-12' wide
- Originated by: Native to Balkans/SE Europe
- Habit: Deciduous, upright, vase shaped
- Foliage: Blue-green
- Flowers/Color class: S/VII
- Bloom time: Midseason

Notable information: Hardy, vigorous often referred to as the “old fashioned lilac.” Perfect for an informal hedge or screen.



#### *Syringa* ×*hyacinthiflora* ‘**Declaration**’

- Height and width: 6-8' tall and 6-7' spread
- Originated by: Egolf & Pooler, 2006
- Habit: Deciduous, upright, rounded
- Foliage: Green color
- Flowers/Color class: S/VI-VII
- Bloom time: Early

Notable information: Excellent specimen or background plant. May also be used as an informal hedge or screen. A nice cut flower for a fragrant bouquet. The name refers to the U.S. Declaration of Independence, 4 July, 1776.



#### *Syringa* ‘**Jesse**’

- Height and width: 4-6' tall, 4-5' wide
- Originated by: George Morel, 1960s
- Habitat: Deciduous, upright, dwarf, re-blooming
- Foliage: Green
- Flowers/Color class: S/IV-V
- Bloom Time: Midseason

Notable Information: After the first heavy late spring bloom, this lilac will continue to flower intermittently all summer long until frost. Can be used for borders, hedges or for stand-alone specimen. Fragrant blossoms attract butterflies. Cultivar name registered as ‘Jesse’ in 1978 . Trademark owned by Pepinieres Minier 1974.

*Syringa* (Villosae Group) 'Minuet'

- Height and width: 6-8' tall and 4-6' wide (semi-dwarf)
- Originated by: William A Cumming, 1972
- Habit: Deciduous, small dense
- Foliage: Dark green, large
- Flowers/Color class: S/VII
- Bloom time: Late

Notable information: This hybrid has three species in its genetic makeup (*S. josikaea*, *S. komarowii* and *S. villosa*). Its growth rate is about half as fast as most late lilacs: 5 feet in 10 years. Tends not to sucker. Insignificant fall foliage. Spicy scent.

Award of Merit 1981, Western Canada Society for Horticulture.



*Syringa vulgaris* 'Miss Ellen Willmott'

- Height and width: 10' tall and 10' wide
- Cultivated by: Lemoine Nursery 1903
- Habit: Deciduous, rounded
- Foliage: Green
- Flowers/Color class: D/I, white
- Bloom Time: Midseason

Notable Information: This dependable French hybrid bears thyrses of beautiful double white florets, twice the size of most whites. Insignificant fall foliage. Does not sucker excessively.



*Syringa pubescens* subsp. *patula* 'Miss Kim'

- Height and width: 4-7' tall and 5-6' wide (semi-dwarf)
- Originated by: Meader & Yeager, 1954
- Habit: Deciduous, broad-spreading
- Foliage: Dark glossy green that turns burgundy-red in fall
- Flowers/Color class: S/II
- Bloom time: Midseason to late

Notable information: One of seven seedlings raised from seed collected by E. M. Meader in the Pouk Han mountains of Korea in 1947. Purple buds open to fragrant violet florets. Royal Horticultural Society Award of Garden Merit 1993. Named by Elwyn Meader for "any or all beautiful Misses Kim of Korea."



*Syringa vulgaris* '**Mme Lemoine**'

- Height and width: 10' tall and 10' wide
- Originated by: Lemoine Nursery 1890
- Habit: Deciduous, wide-spreading
- Foliage: Green
- Flowers/Color class: D/I
- Bloom time: Midseason

Notable information: Named in honor of the wife of Emile Lemoine, the originator of many French hybrids. This showy lilac bears panicles of double white flowers on a wide-spreading bush. Royal Horticulture Awards: award of Merit, 1891; Award of Garden merit, 1937 & 1993; First Class Certificate, 1897. It is very fragrant.



*Syringa vulgaris* '**Monge**'

- Height and width: 10-12' tall and 8-12' wide
- Originated by: Lemoine Nursery, 1913
- Habit: Deciduous, upright
- Foliage: Blue/green
- Flowers/Color class: S/VII
- Bloom time: Midseason

Notable information: This outstanding French hybrid lilac has very showy, short, broad panicles of single, reddish-purple florets. The flowers are held on long stems that lend themselves to great cut flowers. Named for Gaspard Monge (1746-1818), French mathematician and physicist.



*Syringa pubescens* subsp. *pubescens* '**Palibin**' (Dwarf Korean)

- Height and width: 4-5' tall and 6-8' wide (dwarf)
- Originated by: Origin not known, pre-1920
- Habit: Deciduous, compact, low spreading
- Foliage: Dark green, small and glossy leaves that turn reddish-bronze in fall
- Flowers/Color class: S/V
- Bloom time: Midseason

Notable information: Marketed as Dwarf Korean lilac. This dwarf variety has an excellent uniform habit and deep reddish-purple buds that open to fragrant single, pinkish-lavender flowers. Named for Ivan Vladimirovich Palibin (1872-1949), Russian botanist. It produces profuse blooms at an early age. Excellent low growing hedge. RHS Awards: Award of Merit, 1984; Award of Garden Merit, 1993.



*Syringa* ×*hyacinthiflora* '**Pocahontas**'

- Height and width: 10-12' tall and 10-12' wide
- Originated by: Frank L. Skinner, 1935
- Habit: Deciduous, upright
- Foliage: Dark green
- Flowers/Color class: S/II
- Bloom time: Early

Notable information: Deep maroon-purple buds open to single deep violet florets. A profuse bloomer, covering plant with purple blossoms in spring before French hybrid lilacs. Noted for Pocahontas (ca 1595-1617), an Indian princess, daughter of Powhatan, chief of the Algonquian Indians in the Tidewater region of Virginia, U.S.A.



*Syringa vulgaris* '**Président Grévy**'

- Height and width: 10-12' tall and 8' wide
- Originated by: Lemoine Nursery 1886
- Habit: Deciduous, upright
- Foliage: Green
- Flowers/Color class: D/III, lilac-blue
- Bloom Time: Midseason

Notable Information: Named for Francois Paul Jules Grévy (1807-1891), French statesman, president of France (1879-1887). Royal Horticultural Society Award of Merit 1892. This vigorous, upright grower produces immense panicles of starry, double lilac-blue florets. Insignificant fall foliage.



*Syringa vulgaris* '**President Lincoln**'

- Height and width: 8-10' tall and 10' wide
- Originated by: John Dunbar, 1916
- Habit: Deciduous, upright
- Foliage: Rich green
- Flowers/Color class: S/III
- Bloom time: Midseason


Notable information: Named for Abraham Lincoln (1809-1865), 16<sup>th</sup> president of the U.S.A. An open-pollinated seedling of the old "Alba Virinalis" (pre 1841). Medium blue, tall, leafy grower with large trusses and captivating fragrance. This mildew resistant French hybrid is a good grower that produces basal shoots readily. Small tubular flowers grow in large, dense conical-shaped clusters.



*Syringa* × *chinensis* '**Saugeana**'

- Height and width: 10-12' tall and 5-10' wide
- Originated by: Pierre Saugé ca, 1822
- Habit: Deciduous, broad-spreading, round-topped
- Foliage: Green
- Flowers/Color class: S/V-VII
- Bloom time: Midseason

Notable information: A variety of Chinese Lilac with similar characteristics except blossoms are darker than the species. Named for the originator, Pierre Saugé (1757-1835), florist 1807-1835 at 13 rue de la Santé, Paris, France. Excellent hedge plant.



*Syringa vulgaris* '**Sensation**'

- Height and width: 8-10' tall and 8-12' wide
- Originated by: Eveleens Maarse 1938
- Habit: Deciduous, upright
- Foliage: Blue-green
- Flowers/Color class: S/VII & I
- Bloom time: Midseason


Notable information: Referring to being a sensation, this mutation lilac was the first bicolor with purple florets with a distinctive pure white edge.



*Syringa* (*Pubescentes* Series) '**Bailbelle**'

- Height and width: 5-6' tall 4-6' wide
- Originated by: Neal S. Holland pre-1999
- Habit: Deciduous, upright, rounded
- Foliage: Green
- Flowers/Color class: S/V
- Bloom time: Midseason

Notable information: Marketed as TINKERBELLE®. In late spring luscious wine-red flower buds open into deep pink blossoms with a pleasing, spicy fragrance.
